History

The School for Young Performers is a K-12 private school accredited by WASC. Founded in 1995, SYP was originally designed for students needing to balance their education with careers in the performing arts and athletics. The school has evolved to accommodate pupils with learning differences and discerning families desiring a boutique educational experience.

Commitment to Diversity and Non-Discrimination

SYP is dedicated to serving students from all racial and cultural backgrounds, as represented in our community and in our inclusionary perspective, and does not discriminate on the basis of race, creed, national or ethnic origin, gender or sexual orientation in employment practices, admission criteria or the day-to-day functioning of the school.

Commitment to Students with Learning Differences

SYP is committed to supporting students with learning differences requiring a one-on-one educational construct. Teachers are hand-selected to suit the specific needs of these students and have the necessary qualifications to provide special needs services. SYP also offers related services, such as occupational therapy, equine therapy and speech language therapy.

Curriculum

The SYP Program for high school is organized on a rotating block schedule, and 23 credits are required for graduation. Students take 4-5 academic credits & 1-3 elective credits each school year. Each student's schedule is customized to fully engage and maximize the learning process while accommodating professional and/or travel commitments.

The following Advanced Placement (AP) courses are available to our students: Statistics, English Lit & Comp, English Lang & Comp, Seminar (Capstone), Microeconomics, Environmental Sci, U.S. History, European History, Spanish, Chinese, & Calculus AB. AP is an open-enrollment program; additional courses can be designed upon request.

Honors classes are offered in American Literature, British Literature, Comparative Literature, World Literature, Algebra II, Calculus, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, U.S. History, World History, Art History, Psychology, Anatomy & Physiology, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Java, and select advanced arts electives.

G.P.A. & Grading Scales

The following is the grading scale used by SYP to calculate G.P.A. High school honors and AP classes carry a weighted point value and require a C+ or above to uphold weighted status.
